

RTA Dixons Bank, 15th February 2018 - Extract from The Gazette (on-line)

A driver has been cut from his car and taken to hospital after a four-vehicle smash in **Nunthorpe**.

The collision happened on Dixons Bank, close to the junctions with Brass Castle Lane and Guisborough Road, at around midday.

Emergency services at the scene include three fire engines as well as two ambulances and an ambulance car. The crash involved a red Renault Kadjar, a silver Mazda CX3 and two blue Nissan Jukes. The man driving the Renault Kadjar was cut out of his vehicle by the fire brigade. One woman is reported to have head and chest injuries. None of the injuries are thought to be life-threatening.

The road is blocked in both directions and, with no access to either Brass Castle Lane or Guisborough Road, traffic is being forced to turn back.

One witness, Zoe Farrow, said traffic is becoming very congested. The 45-year-old administrator from Ingleby Barwick said: "It's at a standstill. "I'm coming down Dixons Bank now - it's grid locked."

The road was cleared and reopened by 2.39pm.
